

Burton Bradstock School


1845 Joint effort by a clergyman and the Lord of the Manor (Squire) - Pitt-Rivers of Hinton St. George the Squire gave 3 cottages and their land (gardens) and £10 "ingold"! The clergyman (not the Parish Priest) collected money from supporters.

2 cottages were altered to make a schoolroom (i.e. ceilings and interior dividing walls were removed).

Like the Chapel/library and Reading Room buildings standing today.


The remaining cottage became the teacher's dwelling. His name was Zacariah Chick

1865 A larger building was needed - so the old 3 cottages were demolished and the stones used to build a large school for 50-70 children with 2 playgrounds one in front i.e. North side and 1 in the rear, i.e. South side. These exterior walls still stand today. Five lancet windows were made in the East and West walls - and these remain today.




1880 (approximately)
