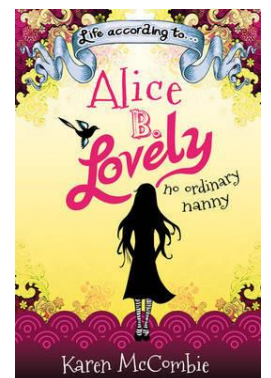
Children's Book Review

Seventy years ago the surrender of the Empire of Japan was announced by Imperial Japan on 15th August 1945 and formally signed on 2nd September, bringing the hostilities of World War II to a close.

1. Zinio E-Magazines

A new e-magazine service was launched by the Dorset Library Service at the start of July. Zinio is a digital library newsstand offering full colour interactive digital magazines.
