Readings

1 Samuel 2: 18-20,26

Samuel was ministering before the Lord, a boy wearing a linen ephod. His mother used to make for him a little robe and take it to him each year, when she went up with her husband to offer the yearly sacrifice. Then Eli would bless Elkanah and his wife, and say, 'May the Lord repay you with children by this woman for the gift that she made to the Lord'; and then they would return to their home. Now the boy Samuel continued to grow both in stature and in favour with the Lord and with the people.

Colossians 3: 12-17

As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God. Luke 2. 41-52

Now every year his parents went to Jerusalem for the festival of the Passover. And when he was twelve years old, they went up as usual for the festival. When the festival was ended and they started to return, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it. Assuming that he was in the group of travellers, they went a day's journey. Then they started to look for him among their relatives and friends. When they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem to search for him. After three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. And all who heard him were amazed at his understanding and his answers. When his parents saw him they were astonished; and his mother said to him, 'Child, why have you treated us like this? Look, your father and I have been searching for you in great anxiety.' He said to them, 'Why were you searching for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?' But they did not understand what he said to them. Then he went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them. His mother treasured all these things in her heart. And Jesus increased in wisdom and in years, and in divine and human favour.

Reflection

I've just bought myself a new coat. I'm hoping it will keep me warm enough on my quest to see the Northern Lights in Iceland next weekend! It's a special coat bought for a specific purpose.

You may have had new clothes recently, perhaps as a Christmas gift. It's easy for us to have suitable clothing for our lifestyle, for our expeditions – the shops are full of choice and over the years it's more of a challenge to manage the amount of clothing we have in this country. I know this by the amount of times we are being encouraged to have a capsule wardrobe, or challenged to reduce the items in our closet to 33! Has anyone here got less than 33 items of clothing? People making New Year's resolutions to clear their clothes out.

What we wear seems to be a focus of today's bible readings:

The thought of Hannah, year by year, remembering how big her son had been last time, making a robe a bit bigger and allowing room for another year's growth is one of those little understood stories that you just can't forget. She has sacrificed this first son, Samuel, the long awaited for, hoped for child – a strong pointer to God's sacrifice of his own dear son too.

In contrast we have the boy Jesus, staying in the temple, learning about his heavenly Father. Showing us and his earthly parents how he is growing into his purpose here on earth.

Then Colossians tells us: As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. We have a choice to make here ... we are not being told we have to be naturally good, but that we have to learn to put on goodness, as a deliberate act, out of love. And the love that makes us want to do it is given as a free gift to enable us to do so. If we are to do this with any success then we have to follow Jesus, learn what he is like. To let his word dwell in us richly and do everything in his name.

As part of God's family, we have new clothes from God. These clothes we are to wear have plenty of room for growth. Room to grow in God's likeness, to develop our Christian faith. None of us is quite big enough to fit into them properly yet because they belong to the Son of God. Yet maybe if we clothe ourselves aright, if we put them on resolutely and accept the help God offers us, each one of us, then eventually we will be transformed into his likeness.

As we begin this New year, in 2022, with all it brings us, life's joys and challenges, let us all step into our new cloak, made especially for us, for us to flourish and grow into during the year, growing closer to God in all we do and say. **Amen.**
