READINGS

Exodus 34:29-35

Moses came down from Mount Sinai. As he came down from the mountain with the two tablets of the covenant in his hand, Moses did not know that the skin of his face shone because he had been talking with God. When Aaron and all the Israelites saw Moses, the skin of his face was shining, and they were afraid to come near him. But Moses called to them; and **Aaron** and all the leaders of the congregation returned to him, and Moses spoke with them. Afterwards all the Israelites came near, and he gave them in commandment all that the LORD had spoken with him on Mount Sinai. When Moses had finished speaking with them, he put a veil on his face; but whenever Moses went in before the LORD to speak with him, he would take the veil off, until he came out; and when he came out, and told the Israelites what he had been commanded, the Israelites would see the face of Moses, that the skin of his face was shining; and Moses would put the veil on his face again, until he went in to speak with him.

2 Corinthians 3:12-4:2

GOSPEL READING Luke 9:28-36

Now about eight days after these sayings Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but

since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, 'Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah'—not knowing what he said. While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. Then from the cloud came a voice that said, 'This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!' When the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and in those days told no one any of the things they had seen.

REFLECTION

My great Aunt; Auntie Hilda loved the film 'The Sound of Music' and was one of those people that you may have heard about who went to see the film many, many times. You, yourself, may even be one of those people. But she and her friend were so enamoured with the film that they made several trips to the Austrian Tyrol to visit where the story is set. One of her favourite songs from the film was 'climb every mountain'; the advice given to Maria by the Mother Superior, meaning that we should face with courage every challenge that confronts us. Being a person who loved the countryside, and who had an incredibly strong faith, Auntie Hilda, not only noticed that the hills were alive with the sound of music; the sounds of bird song, insects, and so on, but also the music in her heart as she basked in the grandeur of the awe-inspiring views. She always said that there on the mountains she felt so close to the splendour of God, and realized how puny our best efforts are in comparison with the glory of his creation.

I suppose, this is what we sometimes refer to as a mountain top experience; although it can come upon us unexpectedly anywhere, not only in the mountains. There are so many places where we can catch a glimpse of the awesome loveliness of nature, and at such times we gain an insight into the creative power of God.

So it was on a mountain top that his disciples had a vision of who Jesus was, and the meaning of his ministry. In today's Gospel reading, we heard that 'Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray.' Explaining in words what he was up to could only take them so far; to lead them to a deeper understanding, Jesus had to give them an experience of prayer. In the silence with no distraction from the noise and bustle of daily life, they could concentrate on God. In the pure air of the hills, they felt able to approach God's holy presence.

Mount Tabor which is traditionally regarded as the site of the Transfiguration, rises steeply out of the plain of Jezreel, where so many battles had taken place. The climb would have been exhausting, and in their tired state the disciples could well

have thought about Mount Sinai, where God appeared to Moses and gave him the ten Commandments. Or perhaps God's revelation to Elijah in the still small voice on the mountain top. He spoke to Moses from the cloud. So when they heard a voice speaking from the cloud they realized that it was God himself. God said, 'This is my Son, my chosen; listen to him!'. So the disciples gained an insight into the true nature of their friend Jesus.

When the vision was ended, Jesus led them down again from the mountain to the plain. There a man grabbed hold of them and demanded that they heal his epileptic son. They must have felt that they had come down to earth with a bump. But that is the way it generally is with a mountain top experience. God gives us these very special times of joy in our lives for a purpose. They're meant to prepare us and strengthen us for the challenges that follow. We can't lie back and enjoy our visions of beauty, wherever they occur. We need to use them to inspire and strengthen us to show practical love to our neighbours. We need to let the radiance that the disciples saw in Jesus' face shine through us into the lives of others, to bring joy and transformation to **them**.

I'm not quite sure where this really fits in, but I know that it does. You may remember the TV advert for Cancer Research UK which was filmed in a Newcastle hospital in 2016. It shows the then four year-old Adyan, who was undergoing treatment after his acute myeloid leukaemia had relapsed. As part of his treatment, Adyan received a type of chemotherapy, and a bone marrow transplant from his sister. He is shown sitting intubated on a hospital bed, singing with his teacher 'heads, shoulders, knees and toes'. He looks a sorry little sight until the last line of the song when the doctor, instead of singing 'knees and toes' sings 'cheese on toast'. Adyan's reaction is one of sheer joy. His whole face lights up. He is transfigured. This small child, in such difficult circumstances, lightened the hearts of many people. I wonder, whatever our situation, are we prepared to do the same, and show how the light of Christ can transform lives? **Amen**

As God's people, let us pray to him now.

Father, we long to shine with your light. Set our hearts on fire with love for you and for one another.

May our lives proclaim: that the Lord our God is holy

Father, cleanse your Church of all hypocrisy and bigotry, and focus our attention on you, so that divisions and barriers crumble to dust.

May our lives proclaim: that the Lord our God is holy

Father, send lives of light among the darkness of injustice, corruption and despair, and strengthen those who are already shining in dark places all over the world. May our lives proclaim: **that the Lord our God is holy**

Father, come into our homes and make them paces of welcome, where your love is woven into all our relationships.

Father, give courage to those who have to suffer physical pain, or mental and emotional anguish. Enable them to draw on your resources, and transform all their pain and sorrow.
