Our 1st **Reading** Galatians 3: 23-end (p1170)

- 23 Before faith came, we were kept under guard by the law, kept for the faith which would afterward be revealed.
- 24 Therefore the law was our tutor to bring us to Christ, that we might be justified by faith.
- 25 But after faith has come, we are no longer under a tutor.
- 26 For you are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus.
- 27 For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ.
- 28 There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one in Christ Jesus.
- 29 And if you are Christ's, then you are Abraham's seed, and heirs according to the promise.

Our 2nd **Reading** Luke 8: 26-39 (p1038)

- 26 Then they sailed to the country of the Gadarenes, which is opposite Galilee.
- 27 And when He stepped out on the land, there met Him a certain man from the city who had demons for a long time. And he wore no clothes, nor did he live in a house but in the tombs.
- 28 When he saw Jesus, he cried out, fell down before Him, and with a loud voice said, "What have I to do with You, Jesus, Son of the Most High God? I beg You, do not torment me!"
- 29 For He had commanded the unclean spirit to come out of the man. For it had often seized him, and he was kept under guard, bound with chains and shackles; and he broke the bonds and was driven by the demon into the wilderness.
- 30 Jesus asked him, saying, "What is your name?" And he said, "Legion," because many demons had entered him.
- 31 And they begged Him that He would not command them to go out into the abyss.
- 32 Now a herd of many swine was feeding there on the mountain. So they begged Him that He would permit them to enter them. And He permitted them.
- 33 Then the demons went out of the man and entered the swine, and the herd ran violently down the steep place into the lake and drowned.
- 34 When those who fed them saw what had happened, they fled and told it in the city and in the country.
- 35 Then they went out to see what had happened, and came to Jesus, and found the man from whom the demons had departed, sitting at the feet of Jesus, clothed and in his right mind. And they were afraid.
- 36 They also who had seen it told them by what means he who had been demon-possessed was healed.
- 37 Then the whole multitude of the surrounding region of the Gadarenes asked Him to depart from them, for they were seized with great fear. And He got into the boat and returned.
- 38 Now the man from whom the demons had departed begged Him that he might be with Him. But Jesus sent him away, saying,
- 39 Return to your own house, and tell what great things God has done for you." And he went his way and proclaimed throughout the whole city what great things Jesus had done for him.

Reflection

Jesus was a revolutionary - always about turning things round, upside down, inside out, and back to front - he didn't fit the mould. he didn't stay in the box, he wasn't restricted by the opinions and expectations of others.

Luke tells us how villagers avoided the graveyard of Gadara on the shore of Galilee out of fear of a violent madman who lived there in an empty tomb. What stories the children must have been told about this man who was a danger to society, a misfit, and an unwanted problem to the area. Everyone steered clear of him.

Do we have our list of 'acceptables' and 'unacceptables'; people to welcome and people to avoid?

Jesus broke the mould because he cares for the excluded - just like Father God who said in the Old Testament

reading Isaiah 65: I have stretched out My hands all day long to a rebellious people, to those who walk according to their own thoughts in a way that is not good. They are a people who continually provoke Me to My face; who sacrifice (to foreign gods) in gardens, and burn incense on altars of brick; people who sit (like the man of Gadara) among the graves, and spend the night in the tombs; who eat forbidden pig's flesh, and who hypocritically say, 'Keep to yourself, Do not come near me, For I am holier than you!' (Proudly religious) These are smoke in My nostrils. And yet my arms are open to them inviting them to return and repent

Similarly Jesus, with open arms, went out of his way to help this man who'd slipped into sin, opened his life to evil and now was possessed by an army of demons. Jesus broke the taboos as he literally faced this man's demons.

When the man said *Leave us alone*, Jesus still came to him, talked with him, went to the source of his problems, dealt with his demons, freed him from the power and control of evil, and gave him a new start.

Now, you would think that the villagers would have been happy, wouldn't you.

But when all the neighbours arrived and found the man *sitting at the feet of Jesus, clothed and in his right mind* they followed the example of the man whom they had ostracised by saying to Jesus '*Leave us*'

It is easy to be frightened by the unexpected, to be uncertain about the miraculous, and to reject the spectacular! Anyway, when Jesus got into the boat, to go away to where he was wanted; the Bible says: *Now the man from whom the demons had departed begged Jesus that he might be with Him.*

You would have thought that that was what Jesus would want - another committed, appreciative follower But Jesus had other plans. He sent him back, saying," *Return to your own house,*

- quite the opposite to the call to discipleship of Peter, Andrew, James and John, Matthew and Nathaniel: *Leave* your work, leave you family, leave your securities, *take up the cross* and *Follow me*

This time, in contrast, he said to this man: You have a family and a community, and your responsibility is to them. *I'm* asked to go, but I want *you* to stay. I need you to be my light in the darkness.

Friend, Go home and tell them what great things God has done for you.

And that is the word that has stuck in my mind: Christ's command to *Tell what great things God has done for you* The question is: What has God done for us? Are we aware? Are we appreciative about what he has done?

To the Christians in Galatia St Paul in Gal3:26 said This is what God has done:

- you are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus.
- if you are Christ's, then you are Abraham's seed, and heirs according to the promise
- you are justified by faith just-as-if-I'd never sinned
- you are no longer slaves to sin and Satan (like the man of Gadara) but you are free

Can we put our name to that?

What has the Lord done for us? Think about it for a moment

Generally, God has provided for us: peace (no war/conflict), we have food, a home, our family, domestic services (like clean water, electricity, and gas), a job, a pension, and so much more

and, specifically. Has he answered prayers? (what about sunshine for the Platinum Celebrations - certainly for Tots since last June when we have had only three Fridays inside). Maybe he has restored us to health and strength (I'm grateful for that!). Maybe he has protected us in danger, There are so many things He has done.

Do you remember the old song sung by Harry Seacombe: Count your blessings one by one, when dawn appears, and day has just begun, they will light your life with happiness, make each hour bright, and bring you light and gladness. Count you blessings one by one, when twilight falls and toil of day is done; and in sweet peace they'll come again to you, if you will count your blessings each day through.

David, the Psalmist, said: Bless the Lord O my Soul and forget not all his benefits

Jesus says: Tell what great things God has done for you

So let us, **Recall** what God has done for us, and let us **Recount** what God has done - to our family, friends and the people we meet or phone today.
